Special Banquet Presentation:

Allie Marguccio Idrija Lace

The great-granddaughter of a Slovene bobbin lacemaker, Allie's passion is evidenced by her continued study and research of the lace of her heritage. Idrija lace has long been a favorite and treasured gift when sent by her Slovene relatives. With the help of her European cousins, she obtained the traditional materials used to make Idrija Lace so that she can carry on the tradition in the US. She has traveled to Slovenia numerous times to tour the lacemaking centers of Idrija, Železniki and Cerkno. She has studied under the tutelage of Metka Fortuna, director of the Idrija School of Lace.

Allie will share her Slovenian family lacemaking heritage and her experiences during her 2008 apprenticeship in Slovenia with a master teacher from the Idrija School of Lace.



The Classes

Two Dimensional Thai Silk Lace Flower—All Levels

Teacher: Janya Sugunnasil

Janya had been designing and making lace for the past 30 years. Her workshop, Saraphi Silk Lace, in Chiang Mai, Thailand, specialized in accepting commissions to make one of a kind lace. One of her current projects is making a colorful and very detailed miniature silk lace, to be mounted on a twenty five inches fan sticks, the work is about 80% in progress and is expected to be finished within the next two years.

The pattern that she brings to this class is a well thought out two dimensions silk lace, the thicker silk thread is used so that it will be easier for the eyes, but is pretty enough to invite touching and strong enough to retain shape after being washed.

For silk lace project, a special Supply Kit must be purchased from the teacher. The kit will include Thai silk thread needed for those projects. Cost is \$ 19 per kit.





Tønder Lace - Beginning & Intermediate

Teacher: Bobbi Donnelly

Tønder is a fine point ground lace from Denmark. Beginners to Tønder lace should come to class with a good understanding of general lace stitches and the use of gimp. Familiarity with the European system of colored diagrams will be helpful. Egyptian cotton 140/2 is the thread used for the patterns in this class. Everyone will start with a sampler that covers the basic techniques of Tønder before moving on to explore the intricacies of this beautiful lace. The pieces range from edgings, many with corners, to medallions so there is something for everyone. Students will progress at their own pace so relax and enjoy the lace.

Bobbi Donnelly has been making lace since 1991 and has studied with many teachers both here and abroad. Currently she is working on reconstructions of old Danish laces from Tønderkniplinger og deres navne from the Tønder Museum in Denmark. She is also designing some additional patterns based on those reconstructions for use in class. In her free time, she is working on Danmarks store hjerte, or "Big Heart", a large piece of Tønder lace from the Karelly pattern collection.

Idrija Lace —All Levels

Teacher: Allie Marguccio

Idrija lace, considered a national treasure of Slovenia, is a free lace characterized by tapes which meander throughout a compact design and are connected by sewings. Traditionally made on a bolster pillow or punklj but just as easily made on a cookie pillow, most pieces require between 5 and 7 pairs of continental style bobbins and a heavier cotton thread. Today Idrija lace is registered as a trademark of the country and great care is being used to preserve its role in ethnic heritage.

In this course, students will learn the basic skills required to make Idrija lace including the narrow braid, corners, gentle curves, picots and plaits and sewings. Students will also have the opportunity to view the instructor's collection of traditional materials and family pieces of Idrija lace.

Idrija lace has long been a passion of Allie's. She has studied under the tutelage of Metka Fortuna, director of the Idrija School of Lace. In addition to weekly private lessons at her house, Allie teaches

beginning bobbin lace at the Bottle Works Ethnic Arts Center, a community outreach program created for the appreciation of the ethnic arts. She will share her expertise in the classroom and her experiences with this traditional lace at our banquet.





Milanese—All Levels

Teacher: Louise Colgan

Milanese is a type of free lace characterized by special decorative stitches that become integral features of each design. The creative nature of this style of lace makes it suitable for both traditional and contemporary interpretation. Incorporating color and metallic threads makes each piece unique. Instruction will cover all levels of Milanese techniques. Students will be able to choose a project from a variety of either 2-D or 3-D patterns.

NOTE: For 3-D projects, a special Supply Kit must be purchased from the teacher. The kit will include wire needed for those projects. Cost is \$12.00 per kit.

Withof Lace—All Levels

Teacher: Susie Johnson

Developed by Sister Judith and her students in the Netherlands, Withof rapidly evolved from its Duchesse roots to become an extraordinary contemporary lace characterized by fine threads, rolled edges, and light and shadow in highly stylized motifs. Beginners will spend time studying the foundation skills. This lace encourages personal expression, something continuing students will have the opportunity to put into practice while refining their skills and exploring the subtle nuances of this lace. A strong working knowledge of bobbin lace is required.

Bedfordshire Plus Lester—All Levels

Teacher: Holly VanSciver

Are you just starting Bedfordshire, continuing Beds or want to have a go at the beautiful pictorial Lester lace featuring flowers, leaves, fruits and animals? This course has something for everyone at all levels. Beginners will learn how to make the braids, trails, leaves, picots, joins and crossings that characterized Beds lace, using invisible starts and finishes. Continuing students will learn crossing trails, joining trails, cloth stitch veins, raised leaves, rolled tallies, trail circles, working with gimp, pattern interpretation and much more. If you choose Lester, select a pattern from beginner to advanced and to learn how to make pictorial motifs like the eagle, parrot, morning glory or oak leaves, incorporated into a variety of guipure grounds.



Extra Pre-Conference Workshop

Special Pre-Conference Workshops

ADVANCED and INTERMEDIATE BEDS

Holly Van Sciver's Friday class will explore the intricacies of this beautiful mid 19th century midlands English lace which features motifs of cloth stitch flowers, leaves, fruits, and animals. Intermediate and advanced Lester requires students have very good bobbin lacemaking skills.

WITHOF

Susie Johnson's Friday's class will provide the student with more opportunity for in-depth discussions than is possible in a regular class day. This class is not for people new to Withof but is suited to all continuing people who would like to have a day where they would have more teacher time and as many questions and answers that can be crammed into one day along with technical discussions and lots of theory in addition to tweaking their work.
